#### D. Catalog Course Description

Advanced Related Service Practicum is designed to continue instruction in working with children and youth with disabilities in educational, recreational, and vocational settings, as well as supporting parents and families at home and in the community. In this course, students will refine their skills in planning and delivering appropriate intervention to children with severe disabilities with a focus in the areas of inclusive practices, training others, assistive technology, and rights and advocacy. Prerequisites: ED113; Concurrent Enrollment: ED115.

#### E. Degree or Certificate Requirements Met by Course

This is a required course for the Certificate in Inclusion, Diversity, and Equity.

#### F. Course Activities and Design

This course entails a supervised practicum experience in a classroom/home setting that has students that are receiving special education services. The practicum will be designed by the student with input from the course instructor and practicum supervisor. The practicum site must be approved by the instructor

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for the course and the student will be supervised and monitored by a designated onsite supervisor and a School of Education faculty member.
